The target of this program is collecting caps of plastic bottles to support a campaign by an NPO "Eco Cap Movement", which donates vaccines for children in developing countries using money earned through recycling bottle caps, and also to think about reuse and recycling goods.

This workshop was part of the Kobe YMCA charity bazaar, and the "Kobe YMCA international voluntary leaders (Kokuvola)" cooperated with Popoki Peace Project for the program.

The day before the bazaar, we prepared a sample of Popoki bottle cap art and a message board to appeal for participation. Mainly people from Popoki Peace Project worked on the preparation, so I wish more people from Kokuvola would help it.

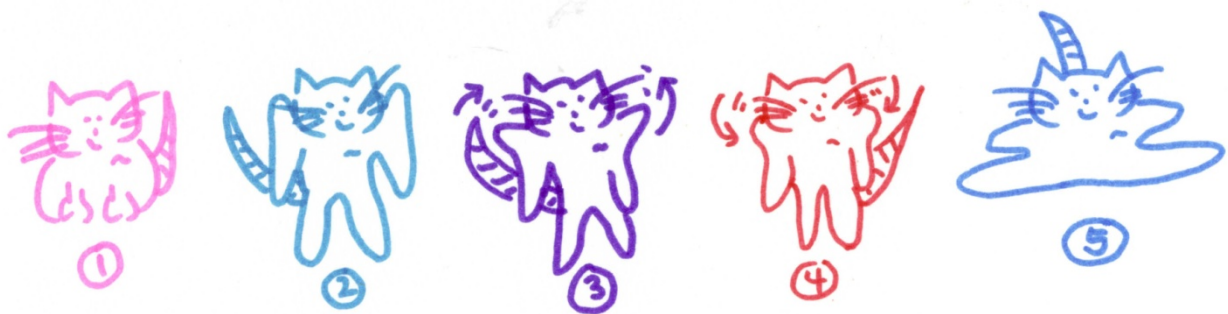
It is very great that kids played and enjoyed the workshop fully.
